Information Sheet

Eagle Falconry 50 CFR 22.24

In order to expedite the processing of your application for an Eagle Falconry Permit, make sure you include the following with your completed Fish and Wildlife License/Permit Application, Form 3-200-17.

- 1 Provide a copy of your master (or equivalent) class permit.
- 2 Outline your experience in handling large raptors, including the species, type of experience and duration of the activity in which the experience was acquired.
- 3 Provide at least two letters of reference from individuals with recognized experience in handling and/or flying eagles. Each letter must contain a concise history of the author's experience with eagles. Eagle handling experience is defined as, but is not limited to, the handling of pre-Act birds, zoological specimens, rehabilitating eagles, or scientific studies involving handling of live eagles. Each letter must also assess the applicant's capability to properly care for and fly golden eagles in falconry.
- 4 Provide a description with dimensions, including photographs or diagrams, of the facilities where the eagles will be housed. For birds, include dietary information and experience in caring for eagles.

For eagles already in your possession, include a copy of the permit under which it is held or other documentation authorizing possession, and the procedures to be used to minimize or eliminate hazards associated with the use of imprinted birds in falconry.

- 6 Indicate the location of records relating to permitted activities shall be kept.
- 7 Include a telephone number, including area code, where you can be reached between 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m.

If you wish to obtain your eagle from the Fish and Wildlife Service, answer question 8. If you wish to trap your eagle, answer questions 9 and 10.

- 8 What sex, age, and condition of the eagle will you accept?
- 9 Provide evidence that the golden eagles to be trapped are from a specified depredation area: copies of the ADC report and/or the permit issued authorizing take of depredating golden eagles.
- 10 Provide a copy of the letter written to the State ADC supervisor requesting permission to trap golden eagles (letter may be sent to ADC concurrently with submission of this application).

***** Permission to trap eagles will not be granted until you suitably demonstrate to the State ADC supervisor, or a designated project leader, your qualifications and capabilities to trap golden eagles from the wild. All trapping must be done under the direct supervision (physical presence of personnel) of State ADC, State of Service personnel. Permission to trap will not extend beyond 90 days from the date of permit issuance. Service Law Enforcement personnel must be notified in writing by the State ADC supervisor of your name, address, location of the specified depredation area and tenure of the permission to trap eagles.**

The public reporting burden for these reporting requirements is estimated to be 1 hour, including time for reviewing instructions, gathering and maintaining data, and completing and reviewing the forms.
