Information Sheet

Special Purpose - Education and Possession Dead Specimens 50 CFR 21.27

In order to expedite the processing of your application for a Special Purpose - Education and Possession Dead Specimens Permit, make sure you include the following information with your completed Fish and Wildlife License/Permit Application, Form 3-200-10d.

The intent of this permit is wildlife conservation education. A minimum number of 12 programs should be presented each year. This permit is only issued to non-profit organizations. You may be required to provide evidence of non-profit status, such as an Internal Revenue Service 501(c)(3) statement. Your permit will be subject to reevaluation if this condition is not met.

1. Give a description of your experience in providing wildlife education programs. List species of migratory bird(s) used, knowledge of migratory bird specimens and educational background. Provide an approximation of the number of years or hours in presenting such program.
2. Include an outline of your educational programs (provide a brochure, if available). Explain why dead migratory bird specimens are needed for the educational programs and specify how they will be used in your presentations.
3. Submit five (5) letters from schools and other organizations which have expressed interest in scheduling your educational programs.
4. List the individual birds specimens, by species, that are needed for your educational programs. Special Purpose - Possession Permits are issued for specific specimens. Provide the source where the specimens will be obtained. Include the name, address, and permit number of the source(s) for obtaining each specimen.

Provide the name, address, and experience of anyone who will be assisting you. They must possess a permit or be listed as a subpermittee under your permit, in addition to appropriate State authorization. Applicants and subpermittee(s) must be at least 18 years of age.

6. Enclose a copy of your current State permit that authorizes the proposed activity, or a written recommendation from your local State Conservation Officer, or game warden.
7. Identify location where records will be kept.
8. List telephone number, including area code, where you can be reached between 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m

There is a \$25 processing fee payable to the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service in check or money order for this permit. Institutions which qualify under 50 CFR 13.11(d)(3) may be exempt from fee.

The public reporting burden for these reporting requirements is estimated to be 2.5 hours, including time for reviewing instructions, gathering and maintaining data, and completing and reviewing the forms. Comments regarding the burden estimate or any other aspect of the reporting requirement(s) should be directed to the Service Information Collection Clearance Officer, MS 224 ARLSQ, Fish and Wildlife Service, Washington, D.C. 20240, or the Office of Management and Budget, Attention: Desk Officer for the Department of the Interior; Washington, D.C. 20503.
