Special Purpose - Education and Possession Live Birds 50 CFR 21.27

In order to expedite the processing of your application for a Special Purpose - Education and Possession Permit, make sure you include the following information with your completed Fish and Wildlife License/Permit Application, Form 3-200-10c.

The intent of this permit is wildlife conservation education. A minimum number of 12 programs should be presented each year. This permit only issued to non-profit organizations. You may be required to provide evidence of non-profit status, such as an Internal Revenue Service 501(c)(3) statement. Your permit will be subject to reevaluation if this condition is not met.

What is your experience in handling and caring for the species you are requesting?

2. Include an outline of your educational programs (include a brochure if available). Explain why live specimens are needed for the educational programs and specify how they will be used in your presentations. Include the names of any organizations or persons who will be sponsoring presentations. If a fee is charged for presentations, please include a fee schedule or the amount charged for each program.
3. Describe permanent facilities where bird(s) will be housed. Provide diagrams (including dimensions) photographs of facilities. Each diagram must indicate what type of material is used for construction of housing and the kind of flooring that is used. Also, you must indicate what species will be housed in each diagram. What is the method of transportation to and from educational presentations. What is the method of transportation to and from the educational presentations?
4. During the presentation how will you be displaying your birds.
5. Submit five (5) letters from schools and other organizations that have expressed interest in scheduling your educational programs.
6. List the individual birds by species that are needed for your educational program (you must be species specific). Provide a letter from a licensed veterinarian describing the injury/illness that makes each bird nonreleaseable. Applicants must include the name, address and permit number of the source(s) for obtaining each nonreleaseable bird.
7. What diet will be used to feed these birds and what is your food source?
8. Give names, addresses and experience of anyone who will be assisting you. They must possess a permit or be listed as a subpermittee under your permit, in addition to appropriate State authorization. Applicants and subpermittees must be at least 18 years of age.
8. Enclose a copy of your current State permit that authorizes the proposed activity, or a written recommendation from your local State Conservation Officer, or game warden.
9. List telephone number, including area code, where you can be reached between 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m.
10. There is a \$25 processing fee payable to the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service in check or money order for this permit. Institutions which qualify under 50 CFR 13.11(d)(3) may be exempt from fee.
11. Identify the location where records will be kept.
